



Some highlights from 2015:



Justice Water Haiti

This year was amazing. We met almost every month this year as a team of leaders, sharing what they had learned and what they had done in their areas and villages. This year, so many projects were completed, people trained and clean water and sanitation achieved. All of our staff continue to work with us in this program, venturing out into some of the darkest and most difficult places to go and work. From mountain top villages with no access to water to using a boat to get over a flood-ridden village and check on their sanitation facilities, all of these team leaders have done it all! They are focusing on growing their team and impact as they change their village one step at a time.

Konbit Kids

What started as 30 kids meeting once a week quickly propelled into 50 and then 75 by the year's end! We have been so honored to watch these children grow and their community change, all because they have a mentor in their lives. Clelie, who continues to be our Family Director, leads this ministry out and has added numbers to her staff and children attending. This program continues to meet once a week for a few hours- switching what they learned, based on the day. Topics covered are: Bible, Haitian history, life lessons and skill development, sports and art.













This year, we were able to provide t-shirts for the students, thanks to Willow Creek Baptist Church, and school supplies for the incoming year. We hosted a month-long summer camp for the children- complete with fun games and a meal every day for the month of July. Thanks to a few of our friends, we were also able to host a huge Christmas day celebration for the kids and their parents, giving the kids each a Christmas gift, too!

We are looking forward to adding more numbers, classes and care to our Konbit Haiti family in 2016!

Konbit Facility Development

This year was wonderful, as we built on what we had already done in 2014. In regards to our facility, there have been a few new things added, as well as more of a vision for the future in regards to our permanent facility.

We have added 2 large moringa grow beds, which now are a bight part of our rented property! We have also continued to build furniture, screened doors, etc. to make our space more functional for us and for the community we serve. More than the things we have built, we have become much more of a staple in the community in general. By using our facility to host conferences and trainings and our on-going programs, we have been able to open our







doors to all of our community. We are very thankful for our facility, our landlord who is also a ministry partner, and our community.

We also have identified a piece of land that we are hoping to purchase over the next few years. We have become a 501c3 in the USA and are going to apply for our status in Haiti in 2016. After this status, we will move forward with negations and partnerships. This land is in a prime spot- between our community in Souboy and the mountain villages we work with.

Moringa Gardening

What started as a business investment in a good friend, slowly turned into our own small business as well. Pastor George (pictured bottom left) is continuing to make a profit and work together with us in his own moringa business. As we help him promote his Haitian business, we have also been working hard on growing our own moringa to prep for international exporting. We have also enjoyed this garden and the grow beds as a focal point with new visitors, as a training point for our friends and community and as a way to grow in responsibility. As Haiti has always been a gardening culture, we are thankful to be able to begin adding to that once more.


